## Do Men Know What to Eat?

There Ought to Be a College Course to Teach Them, Domestic Science Specialist Declares

There should be a college course to instruct young men in the art of selecting what to eat, an instructor in domestic science at the Kansas State Agricultural college said recently. Not only are many men required to select their own food at public cating houses, and by such selection unwittingly impair their efficiency, but they absolutely refuse to cat the carefully thought out meals prepared for them by their wives. They clamor for meat three times each day when the domestic science experts whom, they marry know they should not have it, she added.


